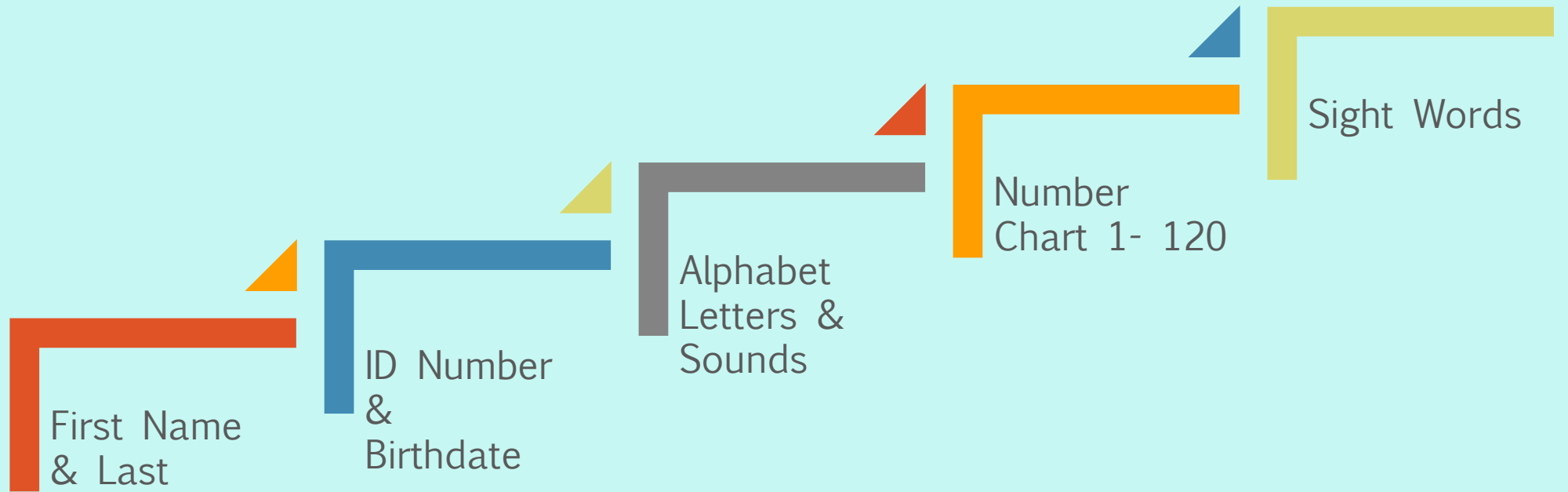

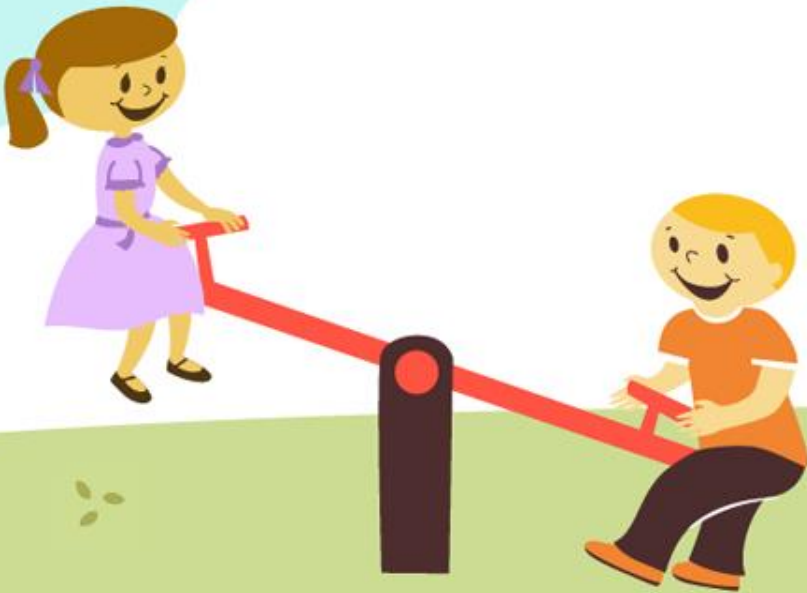

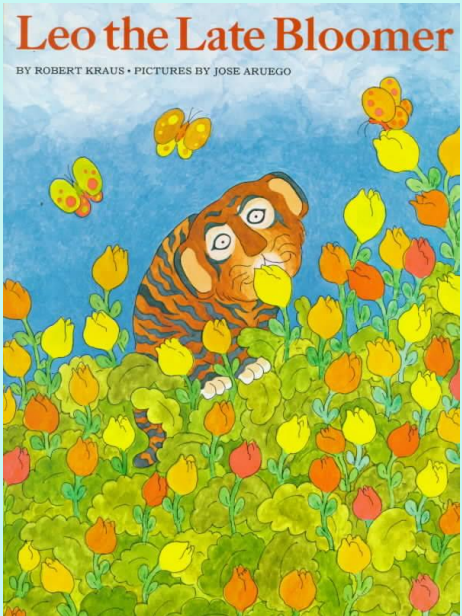


Reading

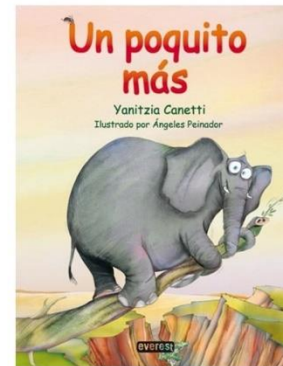
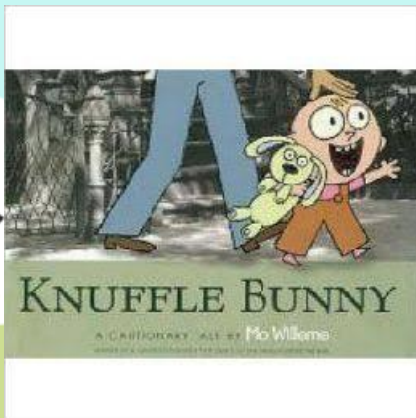
Write a postcard giving reasons why your friend should read the story.
