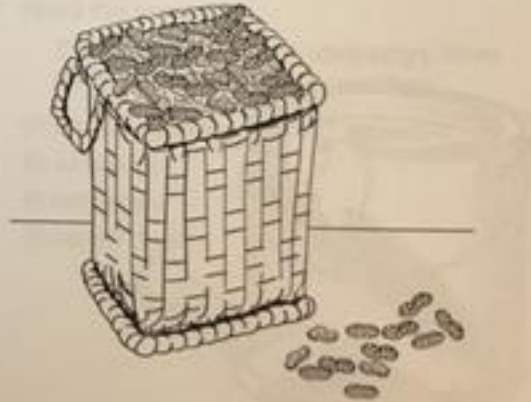
The Peanut Man

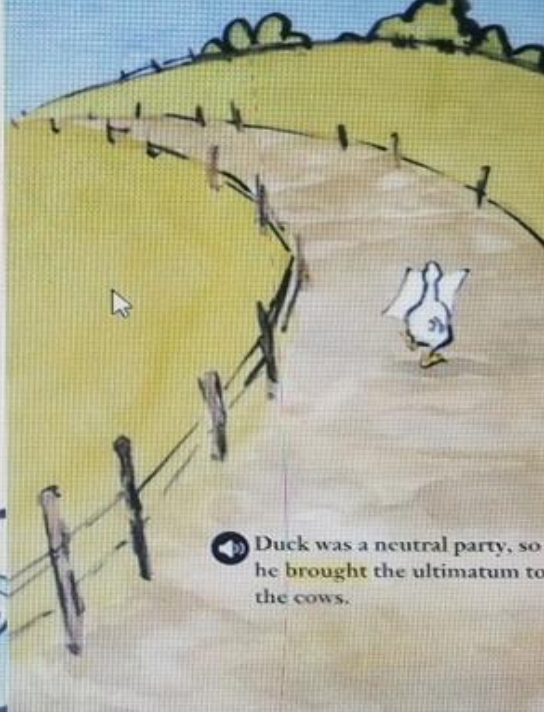

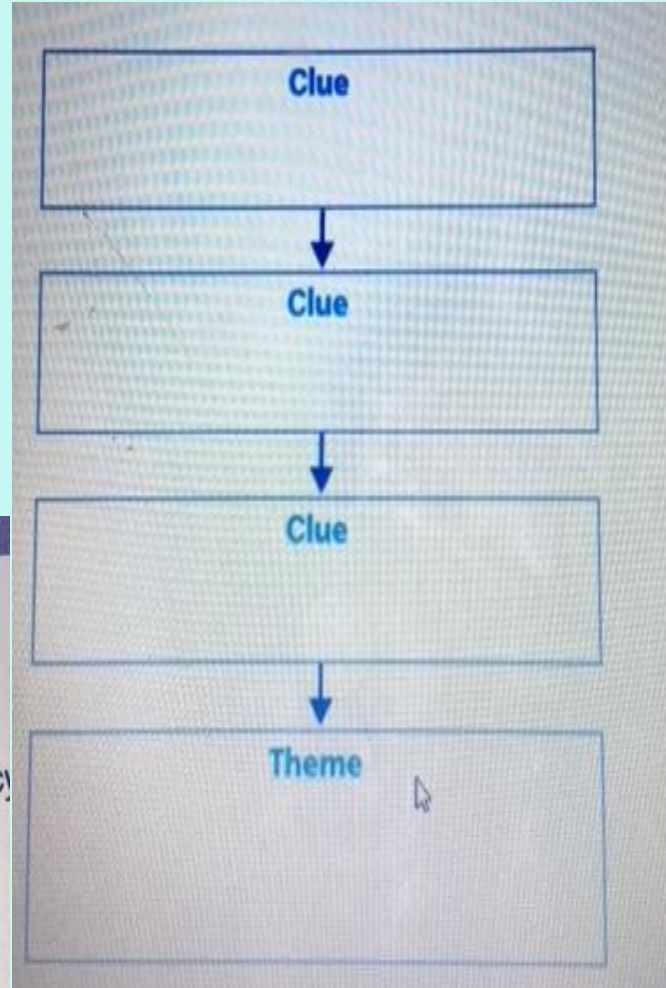
